Major General R. L. CLUTTERBUCK, OBE, MA, C ENG, FICE, Engineer-in-Chief

Major General Clutterbuck was born near London in 1917, and was educated at Radley College, The RMA, Woolwich, and Pembroke College, Cambridge, where he gained an honours degree in Mechanical Sciences in 1939.

In the second World War he served in France in 1940, The Sudan and Ethiopia in 1940-41, and with the Eighth Army in the Western Desert and Italy from 1941-44.

Since then he has served in a number of operations in the Cold War—in Trieste in 1946-47, in Palestine in 1947, in Malaya in 1956-58, and finally as Chief Engineer Far East Land Forces during the Borneo Confrontation and the Hong Kong Emergency from 1966-68.

He commanded 38 Engineer Regiment during the Christmas Island Nuclear Trials in 1958, and has also served two years each in Germany and the United States.

He was an instructor at the Staff College, Camberley, from 1953-56 and at the US Army Command and General Staff College from 1961-63. He was AAG AG7 in 1964 and attended The Imperial Defence College in 1965.

He has had two books and 14 articles published, and a radio play broadcast in Malaya in 1958. His second book 'The Long War'; 'The Emergency in Malaya 1948-60' was published in 1966 in America, and in 1967 in England.

His main sports are sailing, rowing and canoeing. In 1960 he canoed with 23 other men of his regiment across the English Channel in canoes they had built themselves—the first successful group crossing on record.

He was appointed Engineer-in-Chief on 6th July 1968.

THE COLLEGE MASCOT

"Apprentice Beachley II"

The College Mascot is a piebald Shetland Pony obtained for the College by Major The Hon. B. C. Wilson, RHG, in October 1965. The original mascot, "Apprentice Beachley I", was obtained for the College by Major V. F. P. Miller, RA, in the Summer of 1959 and took part in his first ceremonial at the December 1959 Passing Out Parade, when he was introduced to the Secretary of State for War, The Right Honourable Christopher Soames, CBE, MP. "Beachley I" has now been retired to Caldicot. He was bad tempered and not amenable to Parade discipline.

On this Parade "Apprentice Beachley II" is led by his groom, Apprentice Tradesman G. T. Arlow, 69B "A" Coy.

THE GUNNELL MEMORIAL STICK

Ssgt L. D. Gunnell was the Apprentice RSM of 23 Group from January to April 1933. He died in the Middle East in 1945 and, as a tribute to his memory, his mother presented the silver mounted stick for use by the Apprentice RSM.

Each successive holder has his name recorded on the silver band on this stick.

THE WYNN SWORD

Colonel A. H. Wynn, OBE, REME, came to the College with No. 5 Group and was Apprentice Sergeant Major from June 1927 to January 1928. He presented this sword to the College for use by the Apprentice RSM on ceremonial occasions.
