



Army apprentice Jonathan Garnett who died from a brain tumour in February 1987 while at Beachley college is to be remembered in a very special way.

His love of rock-climbing has been commemorated in a specially-commissioned stained glass window depicting a rock climber poised on a cliff-face overlooking the Severn Bridge, the River Wye and the college.

Jonathan (17), who came from Rhyl was an apprentice electrician. His parents gave the window which was dedicated in a special service at St. George's Church on the base.

The service was conducted by the Chaplain General to the Army, Rev. Jim Harkness.

Shortly before his death he had been rock-climbing as part of his leadership course, and the window made for his parents by Bruce Way at the Brockweir glassworks depicts a climber towering over the Severn Bridge, the River Wye and the Army college.
